

CERTIFICATION OF ELECTION RESULTS

The results of a secret ballot election in the above-captioned proceeding conducted by the Public Employee Relations Board (Board) pursuant to the provisions of the Board's Rules, Section 510 and the Decision and Order (Opinion No. 250) issued in this matter, have been duly reported to the Board and to the parties on November 16, 1990, as follows:

"The election was conducted by the staff of the Board, and in accordance with the Election Procedure sections of the Board's Rules. The secrecy of the ballots was maintained at all times. A total of twenty one (21) ballots were received.

"In accordance with the above-referenced Decision and Order the question on the ballot was, 'Do you desire to be represented for purposes of collective bargaining on compensation and other terms and conditions of employment, by the Washington Teachers' Union, Local 6?'
