## CERTIFICATION OF REPRESENTATIVE

An election having been conducted in the above-referenced case by the American Arbitration Association, upon the direction of the Executive Director of the Board of Labor Relations, it is indicated from the tabulation of results that a single collective bargaining representative has been selected by a majority of the valid votes cast by the faculty employees and the registered librarians. Futhermore, no objection was filed to the Tally of Ballots, no objection was filed concerning the conduct of the election and the number of challenged ballots was insufficient in number to affect the results of the election.

Pursuant to the authority vested in the Board of Labor Relations by University of the District of Columbia Resolution No. 78-10, and delegated to the Executive Director of the Board of Labor Relations, IT IS HEREBY CERTIFIED that the
