DECISION ON REMAND

On May 20, 2024, the Board issued Opinion No. 1871² revoking the certification of the Fraternal Order of Police/Department of Corrections Labor Committee (FOP/DOC) as the exclusive representative for employees at the Department of Corrections as identified in PERB Certification No. 73.³ FOP/DOC timely appealed Opinion No. 1871 to the District of Columbia Superior Court and filed a Motion for Temporary Restraining Order and Preliminary Injunctive Relief (Motion). On October 22, 2024, the Superior Court granted the Motion.

In accordance with the Superior Court’s Order and applicable law, the Board hereby stays enforcement of Opinion No. 1871.

1. Enforcement of Opinion No. 1871 is suspended pending resolution of District of Columbia Superior Court Case No. 2024-CAB-003838; and

The Collective Bargaining Agreement between the District of Columbia Department of Corrections and the Fraternal Order of Police/ Department of Corrections Labor Committee shall be enforceable in its entirety, with no modifications, pending the resolution during the pendency of District of Columbia Superior Court Case No. 2024-CAB-003838.
