DECISION AND ORDER

On January 25, 1982, the Fraternal Order of Police Metropolitan Police Department Labor Committee (FOP) filed an Unfair Labor Practice Complaint with the District of Columbia Public Employee Relations Board (Board) against the International Brotherhood of Police Officers, Local 442 (IBPO). In its Complaint, FOP alleges that IBPO has engaged unfair labor practices within the scope of D.C. Code Section 1-618.4(b)(1), (2) and (3), and has violated the provisions of D.C. Code Section 1-618.11 by refusing to represent the interests of the members of the bargaining unit for which it was certified as the exclusive representative.

On February 10, 1982, IBPO filed a Response to the Complaint denying the allegations.

In Opinion No. 33 issued by the Board on February 11, 1982, FOP was certified as the new exclusive bargaining representative.

Since the issues raised now appear to be moot, the Board finds the following action appropriate.
